The thirteenth Neolithic Seminar is taking place at the Department of Archaeology, Ljubljana University. Seminar aims to provide a forum for the discussion of Mesolithic and Neolithic cultural and population trajectories in Eurasia as they reflect in material culture, agency and power, settlement patterns and ritual landscapes, social structures, cognitive systems, and in human population genetic palimpsests.

In the last decade we organized a series of international Neolithic Seminars (<http://arheologija.ff.uni-lj.si/seminars>) to initiate a more lively discussion in prehistoric studies and, to develop the programme of a more balanced exchange of research data on Mesolithic and Neolithic in Eurasia. All the Neolithic Seminar proceedings are available in periodical *Documenta Prehistorica XXI-XXXII* (<http://arheologija.ff.uni-lj.si/documenta/>). Ljubljana University is recognized as a *locus eventi*, and the Neolithic Seminars as a hub for many links and interests that connect the people and institutions involved.
